- Collaboration on the DFG project "Lexical(ized) demonstrations in spoken and sign languages." The project is part of the second phase of the DFG Priority Program 2392 "Visual communication (ViCom)" (vicom.info);
- Collection of new data and creation of an open-access database on lexicalized demonstrations in German Sign Language (DGS);
- Development and implementation of experimental studies on lexicalized demonstrations in German Sign Language (DGS);
- Collaborating with other project members on the development of a new cross-modal semantic theory of lexicalized demonstrations in spoken and sign languages.
- Collaborating with other project members on the development of grammatical descriptions and didactic materials on lexicalized demonstrations in spoken and sign languages.

- A completed university degree (MA) in linguistics or a comparable subject with a focus on sign language linguistics, as well as an above-average master's thesis on a relevant topic;
- Very good knowledge of German Sign Language;
- Good connections within the German deaf community;
- Familiarity with key aspects of participatory research, empirical and theoretical linguistics, corpus linguistics, and experimental methods.
